Coyote Packs Are Roaming

In Las Vegas and Henderson, Animal Control generally will not remove coyotes for simply being sighted or for harassing pets. However, you can call 3-1-1 to report a coyote if it is injured and refuses to leave your property after you try making loud noises to scare it off, or if your pet has been attacked.

If a human has been attacked and injured, you should call 9- 1-1.

A DETAILED BREAKDOWN

- Not for Routine Sightings: Animal Control won't respond to reports of coyotes simply being seen in the neighborhood or harassing freeroaming cats and dogs.
- Injured and Persisting Coyotes: Animal Control will respond if the coyote is injured and doesn't leave your property after you try scaring it off with loud noises.

- Pet Attack: If your pet is attacked by a coyote, you should call 3-1-1, unless a human is injured, in which case call 9-1-1.
- Protect Your Pets: Keep your pets up to date on rabies vaccinations, and consider ways to secure them in a fenced yard or indoors to minimize the risk of coyote encounters. Coyotes can jump 6' fences. Best to keep pets indoors.
- Hazing Techniques: You can try hazing coyotes away from your property with loud noises, screaming, or a water hose if available, but avoid physical intervention that could injure you or the coyote.
- Do Not Set Traps: There are restrictions on using fur-bearing traps, and they can be very dangerous.
- No Guns: You cannot use a rifle, gun, or pellet gun to harm coyotes or protect your pet.
