Flag Flying Days

- 4 May** Loyalty Day / Law Day
- 11 May** Mothers Day
- 15 May** Peace Officers Memorial Day (*Half-staff*)
- 17 May** Armed Forces Day
- 22 May** National Maritime Day
- 26 May** Memorial Day (*Half-staff until noon, then hoisted to the top of the flagpole for the remainder of the day*)

Workers' Compensation

A Chicago handyman was killed when he fell from his ladder while repairing a second story window. In Kansas City, a well-meaning handyman was killed when his electric saw sliced through wiring in a wall where he was installing a new patio door. In Henderson, a helpful neighbor who ran a house cleaning business, broke her arm and wrist when she tumbled from a step stool while dusting a chandelier. In each case, the unsuspecting homeowner faced devastating lawsuits because the three service providers were not covered by Workers' Compensation Insurance.

Well meaning contractors often vow never to hold their customers responsible for injuries. In the Chicago and Kansas City cases, the surviving families filed lawsuits to recover expenses from the homeowner that would have been covered by Workers Comp, including funeral expenses and future earnings. The Henderson woman recovered medical expenses. Homeowners insurance, in nearly all cases, does not cover non-insured workers.



Solera residents are cautioned hiring even the most well-intentioned contractor can be devastating. The state-administered Workers Comp benefits include medical treatment costs, permanent, partial and total disability benefits, dependent benefits in the event of death and more.

State law requires contractors to obtain a certificate of self-insurance from the Nevada Commissioner of Insurance. Homeowners are urged to retain a copy of the contractor's current certificate on file.
