Reminder:

There seems to be a misunderstanding about entry/exit gates and how they affect safety at Solera. Resident safety is in Solera's best interest and many measures were created to aid in making our community as safe as can be. Our **HOA** uses lighting, security cameras, gate locks, and electronic access cards that do contribute to everyone's safety... but these measures do NOT make us a secure fortress. Neither the CC&R's nor rules make this claim. There are climbable fences, people can walk in when gates are open, and there are a number of ways people can get in if they are determined to do so.

Solera has had a very low crime record over the past year. With the help of NW, we that. When someone is up to no good, they often succeed. That's why it is up to each of us to be vigilant and do

our part to make sure our homes are secure. We help Solera when we keep our eyes and ears open when something does not look right, and report it to the police.
