

Business Trespassing Guide for Police Assistance:



If an unwanted subject is on property, did you ask them to leave?

YES

If you answered **yes** and an employee or property representative asked the subject to leave today or have documentation of a previous trespass warning, call 311 for Police Assistance. Advise dispatch you have asked them to leave property and they are refusing to leave.

(If they leave do not call 311/911)

NO

If you answered **no**, ask the subject to leave prior to calling Dispatch. If the subject refuses or does not leave, then call 311 for Police Assistance and advise Dispatch you asked them to leave property and they are refusing.

(If they do not leave, call 311)

When Officers arrive, explain that you have asked the subject to leave prior to their arrival, and that they refused. Officers will identify the subject and issue a Police Contact Card to the property and advise for the Formal Trespass to be read by an employee from the back of the Police Contact Card. Which will document the Time/Date and Subject information for the Trespass.

(Please retain the Police Contact Card that officers provide for documentation)

If subject still does not leave property upon police arrival, a citation or arrest may occur for Trespassing.

Nevada NRS § 207.200: defines the crime of trespassing as entering someone else's property without permission or remaining on their property after being instructed to leave. Trespassing is a misdemeanor with a penalty of up to 6 months in jail and a fine of up to \$1,000.00.
